

Lou Jones in Wayland on April 5

On Thursday, April 5, 7 - 9 pm, Sudbury Valley Nature Photographers will host a presentation by world-renowned photographer Lou Jones entitled "Travel and Photography." The program will take place in the Public Hearing Room of the Wayland Town Building, located at 41 Cochituate Road, just south of the junctions of Rts 20, 27, and 126. The Building is handicap accessible. There is ample parking in the rear. Refreshments will be served.

Raised in Washington, DC, Lou Jones graduated from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute with degrees in Physics. But soon afterward he embarked on a career that would have him taking pictures of headhunters in Borneo & guerrillas in Central America, flying upside down with aerobatic pilots, skulking around opium dens in Singapore, sailing on ancient tall ships & gigantic aircraft carriers & being incarcerated in more foreign jails than can be remembered. He has photographed twelve successive Olympic Games.

Lou Jones' images have been exhibited in galleries throughout the world including the Smithsonian & Corcoran Galleries in Washington, DC, San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, DeCordova Museum, the Fogg Museum and Wellesley College.

In 1997, Jones published his first book, *Final Exposure: Portraits from Death Row*, which chronicled his six-year odyssey documenting men & women on death rows in the USA. His second book *travel+PHOTOGRAPHY: off the charts* has just been released and will be available for purchase on April 5. For more information about Lou Jones, visit his web site www.fotojones.com.

It costs a little more and takes longer, but is very suitable for larger prints. Although I am back at Ritz Camera managing the Braintree store, I recommend you all out west there to check out the newly remodeled Ritz Camera at the Natick mall. It's a beautiful store with over twice the space of the old location. The Print bar is very easy to get beautiful images from your digital cameras. You can even get poster prints up

to 24x36 done on a high end Epson ink jet printer in only an hour.

About the Sudbury Valley Nature Photographers

The Sudbury Valley Nature Photography group was formed in October 1995 by enthusiasts from the local area wishing to share informally their interest in and knowledge of photography. An encouraging rather than competitive environment prevails within the group, which includes over one hundred professional, amateur, and beginning photographers.

Although our major interest lies in nature photography, activities of the SVNP group are not confined to nature photography. Programs and activities include a range of subject matter and techniques of interest to all photographers.

SVNP has no formal structure: there are no officers, no competitions, and no dues. Activities are financed through voluntary contributions to the "Paper Plate Fund."

A monthly newsletter disseminates information via e-mail to members and anyone interested in SVNP. Those who prefer to receive newsletters by U.S. mail should send 12 self-addressed, stamped envelopes to Chris Ridout, 10 Sherman Bridge Road, Wayland, MA 01778.

SVNP meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month, at Traditions, on Route 27, one mile south of Wayland Center, beginning at 6:30 P.M. with refreshments, and include instructional talks, slide presentations, and discussions of slides, digital images, and prints shown by members. The meetings end around 9:30 P.M. Anyone with an interest in photography is invited to attend.

Occasional field trips are arranged to locations as close as Concord's Great Meadows Wildlife Refuge and as far-flung as Utah's Arches National Park and Great Smokies National Park in Tennessee.
