# **January Meeting Notes**

This evening's presentation was by Susan Majors. She and her husband Jay traveled during September and October to the former Yugoslavia -- Slovenia, Croatia, Montenegro -- as well as Austria and Hungary. The trip included a river cruise on the Dnieper River, from Odessa around the Crimean Peninsula in the Black Sea to Kiev.

Many of Susan's photographs were of nature and the scenery, the Julian Alps, Lake Bled, Plitvice National Park and its amazing waterfalls. But many of her photographs were of people, buildings, places, reflections, festivals, local color, fruit stands, orchards, even a short series on bee-keepers.

Several photographic tidbits -- "aquarium technique" - put the camera lens right up against the glass of a window to avoid glare. Susan likes three-layered compositions, the usual foreground, midground, and background, but also, for example, fruit stalls showing three tiers of boxes filled with colorful fruits.

Susan uses a point-and-shoot Olympus Camedia camera, plain vanilla, no tripod and no

filters. To edit images she uses Jasc Paint Shop Pro sparingly.

During the member portion of the meeting, images were shown by Barbara Bergquist, Marilyn Tromer, Tom Petersen, and Don Sherman.

# Steering Committee Meeting notes from January 7, 2010

In attendance: Betsy Moyer, Wayne Hall, Carol Walsh, Linda Crews, Sue Abrahamsen, Jon Ehrmann, and Susan MacKenzie

- 1. Finance: Betsy will explore whether we can set up a bank account in our name, and membership dues amounts were discussed, with \$15 being a reasonable amount to assess. Dues would be started at the September 2010 meeting, if voted upon by the members. We considered what some membership benefits would be if dues were implemented, but made no specific recommendations re what they might be.
- 2. Wayne contact person for website, and will write up something to add to the newsletter for updating the website.
- 3. Contact information sharing will be brought up at the next regular meeting.
- 4. Welcome kit: Could be put together for new members.
- 5. We discussed the need to involve people who don't come to meetings or to the member's exhibit.
- 6. We will try a sign-up sheet for refreshments at the name tag place, and Betsy indicated she would get some new name tag supplies. We might also have some sort of creative name tag event.
- 7. We discussed having someone like Paul Smith give a basic Photoshop workshop for us, possibly on a Thursday in May. Betsy Moyer will check into this and Paul's availability. We might also have more advanced Photoshop classes, either at the regular meeting time or perhaps on another night.

The next meeting of the Steering Committee will be on Thursday, February 25th, at Traditions. Ask at the desk for the room we will be in.

## **Showcasing Your Work on the SVNP Website**

Nearly half of the members who responded to last month's member survey indicated that they were not presently displaying their work on our group website, but would like to.

So, here's what to do to get your own page on our site (http://svnp.homestead.com).

- 1. Choose six images which you would like to display. Technical requirements are:
  - JPEG files
  - A maximum of 700 pixels on the longer dimension
  - Resolution of 100 dpi, JPEG quality setting (compression level) 8 or 9

This should yield a file size, on average, in the 100-200 kilobyte range for each photograph. Provide a title (caption) for each image.

- 2. Write a brief bio describing your photographic interests and accomplishments (see the website for examples).
- 3. Provide contact information (name, Email and/or phone number). If you also have your own website, please include its URL.

JPEGs must be sent as Email attachments.
