## **The Evening's Presentation: Annual Life of Elk**

**Karin McQuillan** departed from her advertised program, which was to chronicle her life on a ranch on the Snake River in Wyoming since her move in 2000 from the East. Instead, she devoted her entire presentation to her experience of having to co-exist with elk herds nearby (i.e., in her back field!) In a series of impressive stills and videos culled from several years of observing, Karin illustrated the annual life of elk, though largely limited to those portions of the year in which the elk are present in her immediate area. They come and go, following food and safety. The program started just after the birth in spring of the calves and described the herd's activities for rest of the year, including the rut in the fall. They don't winter on the property, but just down the road apiece, in the National Elk Refuge.

The narration was delivered conversationally but was very informative. When asked, Karin estimated that the preponderance of the information she was sharing was gathered by observation. With such an incredible opportunity, who wouldn't rush right out and camera up? How fortunate that Karin knows her way around a camera so well and came to the project well prepared. Lucky us!
