INCLUDING MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 12, 2015 MEETING

The March program will be presented by Steve Gabeler, "The Desert Fix – Southeast Utah on Foot". Gabe writes, "A journey through canyons, cliffs and slickrock, mostly on foot, in southeastern Utah including Zion, Grand Staircase – Escalante, Capitol Reef and Bryce. The drive follows Utah route 12 – probably the finest 'car hiking' road I know. Along with the grand views are more intimate 'abstract documentary' images of what is close by and beneath our feet along the way. We will travel about 800 miles by road and 50 miles by trail."

With the exception of May (Images of Viet Nam, Cambodia, and India presented by Terri Ackerman), the rest of 2015 is currently open and proposals for programs are requested.

Carol Walsh announced that details of participation in the SVNP exhibit titled "Art in Nature" to be mounted at the Betty Meyer Gallery of the United Parish of Auburndale in Newton will be issued very shortly by separate email. Carol was at pains to invite the submission of larger prints and extolled the quality of the parish's receptions, as well.

It was also announced that SVNP member Raj Das won "Best of Show" for the Animals in Action photo competition and online exhibition organized by the Photography Center of Cape Cod and the Cape Cod Art Association. The Evening's Presentation, February 12, 2015

Take Five

The assignment for the semi-annual member images night was Take Five, suggested to invite the elaboration of a single subject or idea in five images. It was fascinating to see how photographers differed in their approach to the suggestion.

First, Sue Abrahamson offered five recent images of bluebirds at her backyard feeder. Even shot through glass, the birds showed great detail in their plumage and there was a story in each frame.

Mark Hopkins presented five images gathered from a single walk around the granite flanks of Saddleback Island, near Stonington, in Maine. The textures and coloration varied between images in an engaging manner.

Barbara Peskin continued with two bird sets. The first chronicled some time sitting outside, and close to the feeder for some very effective shots of native birds. The second featured a Snowy Owl taking its ease in Rye, N.H. Again, excellent detail and eye contact.

Hendrik Broekman presented five very recent images of the tips of tall field weeds sticking out of the snow.

Art Phipps had five photos of his 1 y/o Soft-Coated Wheaton Terrier. Art insists on being at the level of his subject so... The first four were of a sequence in which the pup discovers a playmate and rushes the camera. The last is of the grand dame at ease on the stairs – height equalization done the other way.

Steve Gabeler presented five images of trees taken during a climb in Acadia this past fall. As the ascent continued the mood changed with the increasing fog/mist.

Wayne took up the tree theme with a series of images of a neighborhood Gingko: in sprout through autumn leaf-off. The final image of a single day-glow yellow gingko leaf amidst more conservative native types provoked conversation and admiration.

Carol Walsh presented images of some of the great dunes in Namibia. The scale of the accumulation is quite astounding, well delineated in the images by reference to trees or people. Katharine O'Hara presented a series of images based on a single capture of an ice accumulation on glass, fancifully resembling a hand either about to catch or having just thrown a ball. The post-processing elaborations provoked a lot of discussion.

Finally, the group became enthusiastically inquisitive as Betsy Moyer passed on a discovery she has recently made. With the help of a light box she demonstrated a technique for mounting canvasprinted images in a floater frame (i.e., between a sandwich of glass) allowing them to be displayed not only as normal opaque prints, but as translucencies, as well. Betsy's particular sources were, for the canvas print, Katfam Photo in Framingham (katfamphoto.com) and, for the frame, A. C. Moore, also in Framingham. Framingham ...
