The Evening's Presentation

Ed McGuirk gave an engaging and informative program, entitled *Photographing Nature's Details - Macro Nature Photography*. The scope of the presentation exceeded that of the subtitle in that it also dealt with close-up (as opposed to true macro at 1:1) image making for those who do not wish to acquire the gear used by serious macro photographers. Ed started by giving a clear idea of the myriad of gear necessary and its manner of use as well as alternatives. One of the most valuable concepts Ed offered concerns balancing the need for a uniformly sharp subject and isolation from the background. He offered a series of images of Joe-Pye weed which illustrated the practice of adjusting depth of field (with smaller aperture) to achieve an acceptably in-focus subject while choosing a point of view that moves the background far enough away to be rendered pleasantly out of focus.

Demonstrating an alternative approach, Ed gave instruction on focus stacking. If you are not familiar with focus stacking, it is the practice of taking photos at different focus distances and blending them into a single image in which focus is optimized to the taste (and skill) of the photographer. The Joe-Pye weed made a brief appearance to demonstrate that a stack taken at an aperture insufficient to encompass the whole flower head in a single exposure could maintain most of the good blurring of the background, thus yielding pleasing separation in some circumstances. Focus stacking is even more dependent on still conditions for success than shooting single images. Ed demonstrated stacking's utility both in landscape and notquite-close-up photography as a workaround for a lack of lens movements such as can be found on old-style view cameras or available from tilt-shift lenses.

Most significantly, throughout the discussions of technical details, Ed consistently stressed the need for artistic excellence. This is a valuable takeaway, even if one never attempts shooting macro.

Anthony Monteiro showed several images taken on or around the California coast. Seals, sea lions, and several sea birds were included.

Bob Cooke showed 5 prints in the hall outside the Community Room.
