### The Evening's Presentation, March 12, 2015

#### Terri Ackerman: Southeast Asia

The evening's presentation was given by Terri Ackerman and featured images taken on a recent trip in Southeast Asia. Thanks to our recent mild winter, Terri was obliged to join her tour a bit later than planned and started her photography in Angkor Wat, a World Heritage site and the largest religious complex in the world. Despite the fact that the site is justly popular and heavily visited, Terri was able to show many fine details without intrusion. The banyan trees girdling the temples provoked some discussion. After a ride in a buffalo cart, there was a visit to a floating village, which featured some particularly fine candid people shots.

The trip continued to Vietnam and Ho Chi Minh City (aka Saigon). The opening image of commuters on motorbikes lined up many abreast and many more ranks deep was arresting. After a few images devoted to memorabilia of the French colonial past and the Vietnam War, the focus moved to current activities in the country.

Moving north to the area around Da Nang, Terri visited Hoi On, a relatively small community that is experimenting with organic farming. From there, Terri's group moved on to Hue, an old residence of the Emperor. Many of the ensuing images of interiors bore witness of the sort of visual excess common to Royals of the region. The exteriors looked just a bit shopworn, perhaps

understandably so. Terri chose to finish the presentation with Hue, leaving images from the Hanoi area and India for a date TBD. It struck this writer as a very interesting evening with many fine images, especially of candid shots of people.

### **Member Images**

Sue Abrahamsen showed before and after pairs for five wildlife shots taken recently in Florida. The last two pair (the first a group of Whistling Ducks in flight and the second an American Alligator swimming directly for the camera with its mouth full) caused much comment.

Hendrik Broekman showed five before and after pairs shot on walks in March. Just about as much snow, ice and weather from this year as any reasonable New Englander might wish to forget, all in five images.

Gabe Gabeler offered three images taken around the state after leaf-off: a detail from Shelburne Falls, a shot from Mt. Greylock in homage to the Hudson River School and one from Gabe's very own front porch.

Anne Umphrey showed photos taken in Gowing's Swamp in Concord, the choice of which was suggested by the loose affiliation of SVNP and SVT.
