### **April 8: The Evening's Presentation:** The Younger Generation

**Terri Ackerman** gave a fine presentation devoted to the young of many species, including *Homo*. Images were shown from near and far. Backyard or near-backyard young (bunnies, fauns, bluebird, Pileated, etc.) made cameos. The progress of a group of local cygnets over several months was documented. We had wild inhabitants of the Fresh Pond area as well as domesticated babies at Drumlin Farm.

Internationally, Terri showed images of animal young from her travels to, variously, Brazil, the Galápagos and Africa. Human young from Viet Nam, Cambodia, India, Kenya, Malawi and Ecuador made appearances, as well.

## **April 8: Member Images**

**Sue Abrahamsen** celebrated that early spring icon, the skunk cabbage, with several lovely images of the plant, and its welcome post-winter colors.

**Karin McQuillan** echoed Terri's presentation with images of more young from around the American West.

**Ed McGuirk** showed images in honor of past travels to sites in Utah: Both Arches and Canyonlands National Parks as well as Deadhorse State Park were represented.

**Barbara Peskin** offered images closer to home shot during evaluation of a new camera. Deer, Horse (Ginger & Xander) and Mallard took the limelight.

**Hendrik Broekman** displayed a series depicting Red-tail Hawk mating behavior.

## May 13: The Evening's Presentation: Budd Titlow - Bird Brains

**Budd Titlow** presented a program devoted to demonstrating the wide range of bird behaviors. There is no lack of grist for this particular mill. With his own stills and some third-party videos, Budd offered a trans-continental tour starting in his current habitat, California, moving across the American West to New England, and ending in the avian hotspot, Florida. The final video (of crows sledding on a snowy pitched roof with jar caps) is hard to forget!

Budd made good on the promise of the presentation — the group acquired a much better appreciation of the diversity of birds and their survival strategies. Having shown us some of Nature's most impressive treasures, he left us with an impassioned plea for redoubling our efforts toward climate change mitigation.

### May 13: Member Images

**Nicole Mordecai** started by offering some shots of osprey in Wellfleet Harbor and then some tulips shot from unconventional points of view.

Anne Umphrey has, of late, been concentrating on iPhone photography and she displayed some of her most recent results. The images further proved that it's not the camera but the photographer that is the dominant factor in a photo's quality.

At the other range of the gear spectrum, **Barbara Peskin** has been engaged in a dalliance with a Nikon Z (mirrorless) camera. She shared some fine backyard bird images.

**Karin McQuillan** asked the group for assistance in improving a scan and Lightroom. Specifically, the image was a very contrasty scan of an old family photo. A few approaches were offered from the group.

**Ed McGuirk** presented a preview of his June presentation, *Nature Photography in June.* The diverse subject matter ranged from strict landscape, to close-up, to wildlife and beyond.

**Hendrik Broekman** showed a series of a Great Blue Heron returning to, and landing on, an occupied nest at the Lyons Cutler property.


