Program for July 13th meeting: David Kessler

David Kessler has been taking pictures at least since 1962 when he photographed John Glenn's homecoming parade in Washington, DC after Glenn's orbital flight. He started using his father's rangefinder camera with a separate light meter. After that, he took a lot of pictures of his dog—which was really how he learned to handle a camera. During that time, David also learned how to develop and enlarge pictures. In 1965, David went to an arts high school at Interlochen, MI and worked in the darkroom to pay for his scholarship. That year, he photographed a number of events including both dance and musical theater performances.

On two trips to the west coast in the first half of the 1970s, David had the opportunity to build a substantial slide collection by photographing more than 10 national parks including the Rockies, Yellowstone, Tetons, Olympic, Chaco Canyon and others. Later in the 70s, David traveled to Israel and then lived there for a time—and, of course, took more pictures.

Except for the years when his children were growing up, David has tended to photograph scenery and flowers rather than people and architecture.

In 2002, David switched from his vintage 1974 Olympus OM-1, to a digital camera—a Nikon Coolpix 4500. He used that camera on a trip to England, Wales and Ireland. In 2004, he switched to a camera he was more comfortable with, a Konica-Minolta A-2. That is the camera he used for the pictures you'll see. Some of the pictures also used an Olympus 1.7x teleconverter.

Recently, Photoshop Elements has given David the opportunity to indulge his sense of whimsy (for example, including his daughter in a picture of his wife and her bridesmaids), and making interesting simulated paintings from otherwise ordinary pictures.

In February, 2005, David, his wife and son went to visit his daughter who was an exchange student at the University of Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. He took more than 1400 pictures on that trip—most of them during their 5-day safari. Some of those are the pictures you'll see July 13.

Please bring up to 5 prints, slides, or digital images for member viewing. Here's an opportunity if you wish to have feedback from other members who especially value capturing the world of photography as they see it.

About the Sudbury Valley Nature Photographers

The Sudbury Valley Nature Photography group was formed in October 1995 by enthusiasts from the local area wishing to share informally their interest in and knowledge of photography. An encouraging rather than competitive environment prevails within the group, which includes over one hundred professional, amateur, and beginning photographers.

Although our major interest lies in nature photography, activities of the SVNP group are not confined to nature photography. Programs and activities include a range of subject matter and techniques of interest to all photographers.

SVNP has no formal structure: there are no officers, no competitions, and no dues. Activities are financed through voluntary contributions to the "Paper Plate Fund."

The meetings end around 9:30 P.M. Anyone with an interest in photography is invited to attend.
