INCLUDING MINUTES OF THE JUNE 12, 2014 MEETING

Wayne called the well-attended meeting to order by first acknowledging the food contributions of Betsy Moyer, Bob Cooke, Carol Walsh and Katharine O'Hara. Wayne also reminded the group assembled of the upcoming presentation by Katharine O'Hara concerning Yellowknife and the Aurora.

River Stewardship Council

Discussion immediately turned to the project (being led by Raj Das) with the River Stewardship Council. SVNP submitted 89 images to RSC in a timely fashion (Thanks, Raj!) and, not long after, RSC had made their twenty choices, one for each of their specified sites. Wayne expects to have the RSC-selected images on display on the SVNP website shortly. Raj has put together a slideshow of the SVNP submissions that will be shown at the July meeting.

Preparations are now entirely in RSC hands. We are told that the first mounting will take place in July at the Billerica Public Library and that five or six other venues are already signed up. It is expected that the show will be on public display well into 2015. Wayne reports that RSC have been generous in their expressions of gratitude for the SVNP involvement.

Art in Nature

Carol Walsh has submitted a proposal to the United Parish of Auburndale in Newton on behalf of SVNP for a group show to be entitled Art in Nature. The parish has been gifted with an attractive new display space (The Betty Meyer Art Gallery), which is quickly becoming known as a desirable venue. In their limited experience as presenters the gallery staff have not yet hosted a group show and it is to be hoped that the proposed subject will help ease the decision for them to do so. Should the proposal be accepted the time to crank up the creative juices and start photographing Art in Nature will have arrived. Even if the proposal is not accepted why not get going on it, anyway?

Possible Photo Trip to Zion NP

Carol Walsh again expressed her willingness to put together a group package for a photo junket *if* there is sufficient interest. To date Carol has received only three expressions of interest and this seems well below the threshold to proceed. The destination under discussion is Zion National Park in Utah and the time frame originally envisioned was early fall of this year but, in view of the poor showing of interest and to allow for better planning by prospective participants, Carol has proposed deferring any trip until spring 2015. The Evening's Presentation, June 12, 2014

The evening was graced by a presentation by Joe Warfel (www.eightheyephotography.com) entitled, "The Small Things in Life: Close-up and Macro Photography in Nature". From the very first slides the attendees sat enthralled with a dazzling array of images that showed no tendency to repetition either in subject or treatment. Joe is an accomplished communicator who, unlike the Great Oz, willingly parts the curtains on his magic, at least the technical stuff. The sheer creativity on display must go unexplained.

The presentation followed a logical path from images any good photographer might pull off, if of such a mind, to a much broader understanding of how the possible techniques might come to the service of variety, telling a story and, dare we say it, art. The

presentation was paced crisply but with admirable variety and very nicely organized. Just a few of the sectional titles should give an idea: How to Get Close, Lighting, Background, Depth of Field, Telling a Story. His short section on the use of awide-angle lens for close-up photography was thought provoking to your editor. In short, throughout the evening, small things kept getting larger and larger on the screen.

There were plenty of illustrations of gear ranging from simple setups appropriate for capturing images of butterflies to rather exotic affairs capable of capturing images of individual scales on butterfly wings. The well-reasoned explanations of various choices of lens or exposure setting seemed especially appreciated and led to some lively discussions.

Joe's modest, "Aw, shucks" demeanor, conversational style, ability to get ideas across without repetition and raw enthusiasm for his subject were a winning combination for a winning presentation. The room was equally enthusiastic in thanking Joe when Wayne finally rang down the curtain on a lively, full evening that left no one wanting.
