### Photowalk, Wayland, Saturday June 18, 6:15pm-sunset

From the Riverfest listing: "Sudbury Valley Nature Photographers will host a Photo Walk around the Cow Common. Join SVNP member Hendrik Broekman in a stroll around the 65-acre plot, looking for interesting photos in a mixture of forest and field with some views across the Sudbury River marshes (leaves permitting). This is normally a 40-minute walk over flat, easy terrain, but we'll be stopping to photograph, teach, and discuss, ending shortly before sunset. Folks can stay and watch (and photograph) the sunset from the Cow Common or take the 2-minute walk up to the North Cemetery and see the sun set from there. Novices and

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veterans, young and old – no matter. If you bring your eyes, plenty of enthusiasm, and a camera you'll fit right in. #### Book Review - Rip Van Winkle Rides Again

The New Art of Nature Photography, Art Wolfe, Martha Hill, & Tim Grey. Amphoto Books, 2013

If, as I did, you missed the original version of this volume (Art of Nature Photography, A. Wolfe, M. Hill, 1993), this new edition, updated to include information for digital photography, will not leave you wanting for a great deal of valuable information. The mix of photographs has no doubt been changed to include digital captures but most of the images come from film (Fuji Velvia, mostly). Without a copy of the original I am unable to say how much has changed. Nonetheless, the photography is first rate and a joy to study.

The conceit is that most images are presented by the photographer (Art Wolfe) and then commented on by the art director of the magazine for which many of them were shot (Martha Hill, Audubon Magazine). This dual approach, which gives glimpses of both the photographer's wishes for his image and a magazine editor's take on its utility (*publishable* is a word of high praise), helps align the reader's understanding of what qualities can make a photograph stand out. Taken together, both sets of concise, well-argued commentaries can help one to construct his or her visual value system. The modest wash of information on digital photography newly contributed by Tim Grey is basic, wholesome and useful, especially for a neophyte or someone belatedly making the transition from film, but some, perhaps many, might find it doesn't sufficiently offset the dated underlying concept.

The book is rounded off with separate chapters by each of the authors that summarize their advice in fine fashion. If you have the original you may not need this volume - there are more compelling books on the practice of photography in the digital domain. If you do not have the original, this book should be a welcome addition to any library devoted to the art of seeing in general and nature photography in particular. The suspicion that photographers for glossy magazines (and wannabes), the original target audience for much of this material, are starting to elbow aside the dodo and passenger pigeon as symbols of doomed irrelevance renders the book more than a little bittersweet. Even so, good photos remain good photos.
