George and Ruth Brawerman presented a program on Pelican Cove, Florida. Pelican Cove is a planned resort community on Florida's west coast, near Sarasota. George and Ruth have been spending time there for several years and give it high marks. Much of the 75-acre property has a "jungle" feel to it, although just about everything is professionally landscaped as opposed to "wild." There are many walking trails, a creek that attracts varied birds, and nearby beaches with brilliant white sand. Sunsets are spectacular, as demonstrated in a number of their photographs. They showed images of a variety of interesting plants, e.g. bottle brush, sea grape leaves, and eucalyptus trees. Particularly noteworthy was their bird photography. All images were created with either a Canon SX10 or a Nikon Coolpix. (Thanks, Wayne, for taking the minutes this month!)

- Katherine O'Hara lovely cat portraits created in a shelter for homeless cats (tip from the photographer focus on the whiskers, not the eyes.)
- Joan Chasan some remarkable bird photos from Great Meadows, her deck, and Water Row in Sudbury, including a particularly great shot of a bluebird. She used a 200-500mm zoom lens to capture wonderful details and poses.
- Eileen Kurkoski some images from the recent visit of several tall ships to Boston Harbor
- Don Sherman beautiful flower photographs from the Montreal Botanical Garden, using his new Sony NEX-7 mirrorless interchangeable lens camera.
