August Meeting Notes

"BEARS," PRESENTATION BY JOHN SLONINA

John Slonina, professional nature photographer, gave a presentation on three kinds of bears - black bears (in Canada), polar bears (in Canada), and grizzly bears (in Alaska). For those who missed his excellent presentation, or for those who attended and would like to see more, you may visit his website at www.sloninaphotography.com. This also is a place to sign up for his photography tours and workshops.

John shoots raw digital images, often travels with three cameras, two with fast release mounts to affix to a tripod and a third carried around his neck. Thus he has three lenses at his instant disposal, for example 100 - 400, 20 - 100 wide angle, 500 mm with 1.4 or 2.0 adapter.

He finds the histogram, a feature of most digital cameras, an invaluable aid in getting just the right exposure for his shots. The highlights on bears' fur, for example, can be problematic, but the histogram helps him to make adjustments that give him the perfect shot. He avoids using flash since that can frighten his subject away, even if he is at some distance from it.

A few tips for photographing wildlife and in taking daylong field trips were also mentioned. Take plenty of batteries, keep them charged, change them frequently, as batteries often go dead, especially in colder temperatures. Also, previsualize your shots and set your f-stops and focus even before the bear (or whatever) steps into the shot.

Besides showing us beautiful images of bears, John also imparted a great deal of information about bear habitat, behavior, and populations. The polar bear population, for instance, is dwindling dramatically. We also learned the best places and times of year to photograph bears. Thanks, John, for a great program!
