Notes from October Meeting

Our featured presentation was entitled "Attracting Wildlife for the Nature Photographer", by special guest Gail Hansche Godin. Gail was accompanied by husband Dave, her invaluable sherpa, IT assistant, and installer of the equipment she used for her excellent presentation.

Gail began by emphasizing the value of having an environment at home where one can practice wildlife photography, get comfortable with new equipment, etc., before spending a lot of money on photographic expeditions to exotic places where one has only one chance to get it right.

Gail gave a detailed and fascinating recipe for attracting and photographing birds, butterflies and frogs in your own back yard or porch or patio. Though she lives on two-acres of varied vegetation, one needs only a porch balcony to have a feeder and suet to attract a large variety of birds. Birds need three things: food, water, and shelter. Keep these needs in mind while setting up your backyard. She has planted a dead tree in her yard – birds like to perch on it and its open structure provides the photographer with a clear view of the subject. Locate it far from any distracting background to allow for easy selective focus and depth of field control.

Gail favors black oil sunflower seeds, peanuts and suet as favorites of the widest variety of birds. Installing a natural perch for birds to rest on before going to the feeder can allow the photographer to have a little anticipation time before the bird goes to the feeder. Most individual birds have a favorite perching spot that they'll return to time after time. Gail shared with us many ideas about what and where to plant (native plants are most likely to attract birds) techniques of photography, and how to increase that key ingredient -- patience! She commented that "propagated" flowers in a photograph can disqualify the photograph in the "nature" category of some photo competitions and exhibits.
