### The Evening's Presentation

Those who attended this month's meeting had the pleasure of hearing Eric Smith present a voluminously illustrated program entitled *Stories of Wildlife from Around New England*. The presentation went light on *How* but dealt in detail on *What, Where,* and *When*. In particular, Eric discussed the Parker River National Wildlife Refuge, Daniel Webster Mass Audubon Sanctuary, and the Wellfleet Bay Mass Audubon Sanctuary. Space doesn't allow a complete list of the species shown during the evening but, with seventeen years shooting with ultra-long telephotos under his belt, there are probably few common species, resident or transient, that Eric didn't show.

Following the presentation, Eric took questions from the room. One question that got a lot of attention was where to go other than the three plots that he featured. One resource he suggested to use to get an idea of the possibilities is <u>http://ebird.org/content/ebird/</u>. Some of the places he mentioned are Mass Audubon's Habitat in Belmont, Horn Pond in Woburn, the Old Grove Cemetery in Lexington, or any local community gardens for hummers and wrens. He ended with this thought, "Town conservation land can be surprisingly good."
