Bob Cooke presented a thoroughly enjoyable, narrated program he titled, "Bear With Me, but not too Closely." It is a collection of images he took on a trip, organized by Joseph Van Os, to the northern regions of Norway in the expectation of photographing polar bears. If the images Bob presented told the tale, it would seem that the expectations were fulfilled in generous measure. The story was far richer than that, though, and involved seals, ex-seals, gray weather, a 70-year-old boat and birds galore with a walrus or two thrown in as a garnish. **Steve Gabeler** continued the work Ed McGuirk started by presenting an expansive series of images that spanned the New Hampshire White Mountains to Acadia National Park. Gabe's trademark attention to intriguing ambiguities was fully in evidence.
