GEAR

Birding Lens #1: CANON EF 400mm f4 DO IS-II USM ~ \$8,000

Birding Lens #2: CANON EF 100-400 L II IS USM	~ \$2,000
<u>Birding Camera:</u> EOS 7D Mark II	~ \$1,400
Birding Accessory: EF 1.4X III Extender	~ \$420

TIPS

- Either lens above (#1 or #2) will produce excellent results with or without the 1.4X extender attached
- The camera above or equivalent SLR model (produced within past three years) will allow high ISO shooting (i.e., >1600) with minimal noise/distortion
- <u>For excellent hand-held results:</u> Shoot only at ISO 1600 and above Shoot only at 1/2500 and above Shoot only using high-speed drive (i.e., 5-10 fps)
