Presentation: Paul Green's Plant Book: An Alphabet of Flowers & Folklore

Presented by Betsy Moyer and Doreen O'Connor

Betsy Moyer has worked on this labor of love for nearly four years to produce a newly published, beautifully illustrated, sampling of flowers, plants, and folklore: *Paul Green's Plant Book: An Alphabet of Flowers & Folklore* (Published by North Carolina Botanical Garden, 2005) based on a posthumously published wordbook by her dad; a Pulitzer Prizewinning playwright and Dramatist Laureate of the State of North Carolina; *Paul Green's Word Book: An Alphabet of Reminiscence* (Appalachian Consortium Press, 1990).

A slide presentation illustrated the following plants, with accompanying dramatized folklore of the Cape Fear Valley, North Carolina, area, directly quoted from the original book by Paul Green. Purposefully chosen, these plants grow wild in Massachusetts as well.

Although our major interest lies in nature photography, activities of the SVNP group are not confined to nature photography. Programs and activities include a range of subject matter and techniques of interest to all photographers.

SVNP has no formal structure: there are no officers, no competitions, and no dues. Activities are financed through voluntary contributions to the "Paper Plate Fund."
