### **December Meeting Notes**

The subject of our member images night is: "Baby, It's Cold Outside!" - so remember to head outside this season and capture images to share at our February meeting!

Warren Bailey demystified Adobe Lightroom 2 for us at the meeting. One of the benefits of using Lightroom 2 over Photoshop is that all the edits do nothing to the original photo, so that you don't lose your original data. Photos can be organized into catalogs, tagged in order to find them again (useful for us who put images on the web, too - by tagging photos, others can find them by doing a google search), as well as ranked.

Another benefit is Lightroom's ability to synchronize settings across pictures. In addition, by making a copy of a photo (it makes a new virtual copy, which takes up little space) and working on it in Lightroom, a lot of space is saved on the computer. Files are only saved in their large form when they are exported out of Lightroom and put back on the computer itself. Exporting files as a catalog will also export the changes you've made to your photos. A lively question and answer period followed the demonstration. Thanks, Warren, for a great program!
