The space was lovely, and a great place to see Marilyn Tromer's images of Thailand. Marilyn traveled to Thailand in October and November of 2009 with Overseas Adventure Tours. She took us on quite a journey through Thailand! Highlights were the various Wats (temples) that she visited, the old capital city of Sukhothai, native crafts and paper making, and the elephant park, where elephants go now that it is illegal for them to be used in the logging industry. Marilyn also had great pictures of the Mekong River, and Myanmar (formerly Burma). She used a Canon 570 to take the photographs, and they were lovely! Jean Brockington and Murray and Trudy Drobnis brought drinks. SVNP supplied the cookies.

The info below is a follow-up from what Chris Day mentioned at the meeting:

Faststone image viewer is a very capable, intuitive and easy to use image browser, slide show viewer and editor. It includes the ability to move images around in the viewer, a rarity, and an excellent batch rename, resize and framing capability. The latest version of the editor includes live histogram, curves, clone and patching tools. Chris makes it his default viewer for .jpg files. It also shows .raw thumbnails. <a href="http://www.faststone.org/">http://www.faststone.org/</a>
The price is right, free!

For those of you who use Photoshop Elements you might be frustrated by the lack of curves adjustments. This is a free download for curves. <a href="http://free.pages.at/easyfilter/curves.html">http://free.pages.at/easyfilter/curves.html</a>

It works well and is to be found at the bottom of the filters menu.

Also for those who appreciated content aware in PSE 9 and 10 you might think that Adobe was mean not to include the Content Aware Fill function. There is now a download for this which when installed appears in the effects window. It works well and is also free. It does require simple free registration to download the .zip file.
