Presentation by Brian Donahue

Our guest began with his thoughts on the meadowlands of the Concord River and its tributaries (an interesting local history lesson). Brian is an environmental historian, professor at Bentley College, and author of several books. Brian's most recent work is *The Great Meadow*, a book about the 1620 farming era in the area of the Concord River when the cultivation of hay was the primary farm industry, and used by the Colonists mainly to feed farm animals.

RIVERFEST ANNOUNCEMENTS

Here are possible subjects for slides Brian Donahue mentioned that might accompany his slide LECTURE ON SUNDAY, JUNE 13:

- Tributary brooks to the Sudbury or Concord Rivers -- Pantry Brook in Sudbury, e. g. there are many.
- Bridges (e. g., North Bridge in Concord, Sherman Bridge in Wayland, Lee Bridge in Lincoln, etc.)
- Migratory waterfowl (Perhaps you'd include marsh wrens and other marsh-loving birds.)
- Marsh plants, like buttonbush? Are you tired to death of loosestrife? I bet every one of our photographers has multiple shots of that gorgeous pest.
- River animals -- beaver, muskrat, etc., and their homes
- Meadows -- vestiges of the old meadow systems exist in Concord, near the Center, and in Wayland through and beyond the ball field on Alpine Road, where palmetto and blue point grass still grows. In the latter case you suggested we call Great Meadows Wildlife Sanctuary in Sudbury first for permission because the meadows are on their land.
- Rock walls
- Red maple swamps and the ditches that were built along them during colonial times.
- Billerica Dam
- Mills Interactions of people with the river
- Rivers in flood (That should be an easy one right now!)
- Brian was particularly interested in the river section from Saxonville Dam in Sudbury to the Billerica Dam in Billerica.

We will get our slides to Brian by June 1, and he will make a selection. Slides should be clearly marked with a thumb print in the lower left corner for correct orientation, your name, and the title of the slide.

We are planning Several Field Trips to take photographs of some of these subjects, including May 15 (rain date 16th) to meet somewhere in the Great Meadows National Wildlife Reservation early AM, specific spot and time tba.
